
Jennifer Aniston Says She and Justin Theroux 'Already Feel Married'

What really changes when you get married? Money? Sex? Commitment? Cupid has some advice for you to show you what can change when you tie the knot:



1. Guest list: If you want the ceremony to be more intimate


then don't go crazy with your guest list. Only invite immediate family members and friends that you're super close with.

the economic waters of your wedding:



So, you've been thinking about tying the knot. You've been with your significant other for awhile now and it's only


natural to start thinking about taking the next step. How do you if you're really ready for marriage? Cupid has some advice:

some brides like to keep things more low key. If you're one of those women who like to keep things simple and intimate, Cupid has some tips:






start with your ideal budget you will quickly learn how many people you can afford to invite.

Theme parks are made so people can have fun. If you want your marriage proposal to be something neither of you will ever


forget, an amusement park location might be just the ticket. Cupid has some tips:

A big part of life is giving out second chances. Cupid has some ways to tell if you should give one to your ex:




Choosing a venue is an important part of any wedding. Sometimes the best choice is to stay close to home. Cupid has some advice:



- 2. And Guest?: Allowing all of your guests to bring a date







1. Trust: For a relationship to be able to make the leap to marriage the couple must trust each other above all else. If


you don't have a shared trust then the foundation of your union is a weak one.

1. Choose the wedding size: Before anything else, you and your partner need to decide how large you want your wedding to be.


Once you've picked a guest count, then you can start prioritizing potential invitees.

Finding the right ring is a long and hard process. Cupid is here to help:


- 1. Pay attention: There are a lot of choices out there! Look at what your sweetheart wears on a daily basis. That should give you a clue of her style.




