Celebrity Interview: Hollywood's Most Sought-After Hair Colorist Michael Canale Talks Tips for At-Home Hair Care and His New Hair Line

Michael Canalé is an American hairstylist, colorist, and the creator of Canalé Hair Care Products. Yet, he's mainly famous for being the most sought-after hair specialist in Hollywood.

Being a part of the entertainment industry for years, his hands have worked magic on the likes of Reese Witherspoon, Jennifer Aniston, and Kate Hudson. In fact, Canalé is responsible for "The Rachel" look on Aniston that dominated the widely successful, early 2000s sitcom *Friends*. But, he's recently decided to branch out and start his own line of hair care products to further help others outside of his grasp. On top of that, he has spoken out about the importance of selfcare and how to maintain your color during this time of quarantine.

In our exclusive celebrity interview, we chat Michael on his rise in the industry, advice over safe hair coloring tips, tricks to try at home, and his new hair line Canalé.

How did all of this start for you? Was there a specific moment you remember that caused you to want to become a hair colorist?

I was a biology minor and have always been on the chemical side of the industry. Early in my career, the colorist where I worked did not show up to the salon. The makeup artist asked me if I wanted to learn how to color hair with him. So, he taught me how to identify the right color for each type of complexion. He also showed me 3 techniques that I have expanded over time, making my own numerous techniques while retaining those 3 main concepts.

You've worked with very well-known clientele over the years. Jennifer Aniston.... Kate Hudson.... Are there any stories you can tell us about your favorite experiences with some of them?

I am a colorist, and I work by myself. It was amazing to see

Jennifer blow-dry her own hair as well as any stylist! Heidi Klum was the only person that ever made me blush just by her looking at me. I am honored to work with a lot of my actresses, trusting me to color their hair during their pregnancies, like Kate Hudson!

You've been voted 14 years in a row by Allure Magazine as being the "best of the best" and even received praise from Vogue. You have such a prolific career. What advice do you have for young children or even young stylists who want to get into the field?

Learn from the best, work with the best, and never let them down. Make the master stylist proud. Remember to keep the health of the hair, use what the client naturally has to achieve — what they desire. Work with their natural base color and their hair consistency to enhance their overall look.

With the state of the world right now and everyone being at home due to quarantine, what are some at-home hair coloring tips for our audience?

Between seeing your colorist and seeing them again, do not do anything that will ruin your hair. While quarantined, you can use concealers like spray and powders that cover grey. This lasts until you wash it out. Another option is demi or semipermanent. Demi will last up to 2 weeks while semi can last up to 6 weeks when using the right hair products. Both will keep your hair color intact while waiting to see your hairdresser again. If you choose to dye your hair, remember hairlines grab darker, so try to stay lighter around the hairline. You will have to purchase 2 different boxes of color. For example, if you are doing your base medium brown use light brown around your hairline. Also for brunettes, try a color bath with the remainder of the hair color! Use a base color, you can add water and shampoo to the remaining color in the bottle and lather it into the ends of the hair to refresh it for the last 5 minutes of the process.

From your perspective, what are the hair color trends at the moment?

Roots are in! Try to preserve or prolong your hair color. I recommend using a color and shine-boosting gloss. All of my New <u>SIGNATURE GLOSSES</u>, can really refresh and enhance color for both highlights and base colors. The <u>SUNKISSED GOLD</u> for warmer skin tones and <u>COOL BLUE</u> for cooler skin tones will brighten up your blonde while <u>MIDNIGHT BLUE</u> cools down any brassy tones on blondes or brunettes. They last up to 2 weeks, the results are amazing! I am currently providing samples to my clients in my Canalé At Home Personalized Color Kits. Celebrity Interview: 'Temptation Island' Host Mark Walberg Shares His Thoughts on Season 2 and Physical Infidelity vs. Emotional Connection

Mark Walberg (not to be confused with film actor Mark Wahlberg) is an American actor, on-air television personality, and talk show host known primarily for Antiques Roadshow, The Moment of Truth, and both the original (Fox Network: 2001) and the modern reboot (USA Network: 2019), Temptation Island. Walberg's time on Temptation Island is split between acting as the host and being a relationship confidant who couples go to for guidance through all kinds of relationship struggles they experience on the show. In our exclusive celebrity interview, Walberg offers our visitors his thoughts on the second season of the show, and some dating advice for any couple going through hardships.

Temptation Island is a reality show that follows four couples who are struggling in their relationships and can't decide whether to call it quits or not. When they arrive on the island, they are separated and put onto different parts of a beautiful island for four weeks, where they are tempted by other relationship options. The show has seen booming success since the first season of its reboot aired at the beginning of 2019. With season two premiering just a few weeks ago, the drama-filled show has only turned up the heat with its steamy antics.

A season that Walberg claims is "really on steroids" as far as content goes, he explains that what ends up happening with these couples isn't scripted. The producers aren't in charge of turning the heat up, despite the drama escalating quickly this season. According to Walberg, it all depends on the couple and their personal journey. For example, Ashley G. slept with someone in the first episode, and that's something that just didn't happen in the first season of the show.

Walberg likes the idea of producers not being in control, because it allows him to be more open and vulnerable with the couples. In the second episode, Walberg has a conversation with Rick about Ashley's infidelity, saying that he's sincerely hurting alongside Rick. He takes his role with the couples very seriously, admitting, "I want the best for them. I'm very well aware that it's probably not going to go the way that they hoped or thought they could control, but the bigger question, to me, is always about yourself. What brought you here? It's not about the other person." He expands on this statement, explaining how he handled his discussion with Ashley G., hinting that she has great remorse about hurting Rick in later episodes.

When asked if a couple can come back from something like what Rick and Ashley G. are going through, he provides some great advice about the differences in every couple and how they handle hardship. According to Walberg, every couple is unique and thinks differently about their relationship. If you're talking about two people who have built a foundation from an on-again off-again dynamic, it's obvious that the couple has been able to forgive one another and get back together after past conflict. Walberg is serious when he asks couples, "Do you think you can come back from this?" He says, "When you sit and break it down, there's a lot of grey area between the black and white. I know that people watching at home are like, 'If anybody did that then it's over,' but relationships with these people are years long and unique to them."

Watching season 2 of *Temptation Island*, we observe events like David's threesome, Ashley's infidelity, and then cases like Casey's where he claims that his relationship with Ashley H. is weak, stating, "I could break-up with her and be fine." Does that raise questions about what really hurts more, physical infidelity or emotional connection? Walberg seems to think that a lacking emotional connection is much scarier than a physical in fidelity. Physical intimacy doesn't always cause a bond to form, and he agrees with viewers who believe that emotional connections are the ones that are lasting.

Despite our curiosity, Walberg remains tight-lipped about who he thinks will survive as a couple and who he's rooting for, but he does touch on the growth he's seen from both Rick and Ashley H. He thinks that Rick's backstory of being a playboy is interesting when you see how he grows throughout the season. He even singles out Ashley H. and applauds her for her development from being extremely sensitive to radiating a sense of strength by the season's end.

In fact, Walberg explains that the island is a vehicle for couples to seek answers in different facets of their lives. "For some guys that require self-love, and sometimes [they] just do things I can't figure out. But, my hope is that everybody leaves the island feeling like the experience helped them grow in some way or another." If the couples are committed to going to the island, there is a sense of selfreflection that they have to go through and work on. It's a natural process that happens on its own for every couple. With shows like *Temptation Island*, it can be an addicting experience for the audience. So, it isn't surprising that fans become attached to the show, because they see parts of themselves or their relationship in some of the couples on screen. People can relate to wondering whether or not they're settling in their relationship. It's easy to empathize with the struggles when it comes to finding your "person."

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Relationship struggles are a reality for all couples, and Walberg stresses the importance of communication to overcome those low points. Not all folks can hop a plane and become part of a reality show to fix their problems, he says, but, "If you can talk about it, you've got a shot. Talk it out, and if you need to find professional help to talk it out, that might be the best way."

And, speaking of communication, Walberg is still in touch with the entire cast from season 1 through Instagram! He says he's still friendly with all of them, pointing out, for instance, that Evan reached out to him personally when he and Morgan announced their engagement.

So, what can we expect from upcoming episodes? Walberg wasn't very forthcoming on this, but he told us to keep a watch on the dynamic between couples shifting from potential love interests to supportive friends, as well as seeing romantic connections grow. And, get ready for some entertainment! According to Walberg, the final bonfire is "pretty riveting."

Stay tuned! If Walberg's insight is anything to go on, *Temptation Island* is about to get insanely entertaining.

Recently, she has been very vocal about women's rights and the feminist movement, joining organizations and using her credibility to make a stand against misogyny.

In our celebrity interview with Sophia Bush, she talks about making the leap from the big screen to the activist scene.

1. Can you tell us about your latest campaign with *Always*?

I'm so proud to be working with Always on this important mission to help #EndPeriodPoverty. Last year, we were able to donate 20 million period products in the U.S. This year we're millions of additional products via Always' donating longstanding partner, Feeding America, and local Period Heroes who are already working to #EndPeriodPoverty for school-aged students in their communities! 2. What made you want to join the campaign?

I was honestly shocked and disheartened when going over the data that shows that nearly 1 in 5 girls in the U.S. have either missed school entirely or left school early because they lacked access to basic period products. Here in the Los Angeles area alone, 88,000 students have missed school because of period poverty. That's why I'm honored to team up with *Always* to help raise awareness of this issue and make a difference. We cannot begin to tackle an issue if no one knows about it, so breaking the taboo and having the conversation is an important first step!

3. Another campaign you have been a part of and helped found is the *Times' Up movement*. How has this movement affected your life? Your dating life?

Well, I find it sad that there's some sort of fear that women speaking up for themselves - and their friends and coworkers would somehow shrink their dating options. Or, that it's part of the consideration in the conversation around equity and eradicating sexual harassment in the workplace. I want to be clear- pursuing someone romantically and harassing someone in the workplace do not, ever, overlap or intersect. Nor should they. My understanding of that reality hasn't made men run away from me. And if it did, trust me they wouldn't be the right men for me or for any of us. *Times' Up* has been a long time coming. As has the general conversation about treatment in the workplace. Women deserve to go to work and just do their jobs, the way men get to. The considerations and practices women have had to think about, just to avoid mistreatment while working, are an unfair amount of emotional labor, period. I'm glad we are in an era where we are talking about these things. I'll be even more glad when we see substantive, structural change taking place across industries. The conversation is certainly the first step, the awareness

aspect is integral, but we need to see action taken as well. In my own life, I feel much safer and freer to be creative on sets where respect for everyone present has been clearly expressed. Where performers and crew alike are assured that they are supported. It matters.

4. Time's Up was founded by a number of other talented women. What are some lessons/ advice you have learned from the women you have campaigned with?

There are strength and safety in numbers, that's for sure. Whether it's the famous faces who have been able to garner global attention for the cause, those who champion behind the scenes, brilliant legal minds running the defense arm of the organization, I am in awe of how a committed group of women who are relentless in their pursuit of justice can effect change.

SallyAnn, we last spoke about *Martha and Snoop's Potluck Dinner*, so I have to start off with saying congratulations because that's a tremendous success and your first Emmy nomination! How does that make you feel?

Salsano: I'm super proud of that. They are such power houses, superstars, and household names worldwide. Working with them – there's almost nothing they won't do. They are super dedicated 24/7 and on set with you morning, noon, and night. And creatively, it's really fun. We really had a great time.

You've said that there are a lot of commonalties between them, even though people may view them as so different. Do you think that played a role in the show's success?

Salsano: There's all this hullabaloo now in our world about different people and people being against each other. If the country was more like this show, we'd be in a better place. If you like someone, nothing brings you together more than a good meal and good conversation. Just get together and have a good time! It doesn't matter where you're from, where you're raised, or what you're like. At the end of the day, we all like to eat, laugh, and have fun. That's basically what this show's about.

Absolutely – great point. Patti, last month, you were on *Hollywood Medium* with Tyler Henry, and you shared that your adoptive mother was really good at giving you advice. What was that experience like?

Stanger: It's not so much what he says and how he says it. It's more like, when you're in the room, there's a strong energy. You *feel* the presence of your loved one. He's a guy that brings in the energy of your loved ones, and you feel loved. My mom died a really horrible death of lung cancer, and at the end, she was in a lot of pain. So knowing that she was okay was important to me. And then my biological mother showed up — that was all really nice. I never met her, but I felt a presence. You can't tell that though the television though.

Now, let's talk about *Love Blows*. This is just an amazing collaboration. Who came up with the idea?

Salsano: Patti!

Stanger: I came up with the idea. I wanted SallyAnn involved because she did *Jersey Shore*, and I envisioned this show to be in the same style. I just thought she was the perfect powerhouse to go into Chicago and turn it upside down. Chicago didn't have it's own reality TV show, which was really important.

These are people I work with – I'm like the head affiliate for matchmakers around the world. I'm the one generating leads, giving them advice, and training them. So Lisa used to fix me up – we were like sisters. One day, she told me the story about her husband who cheated on her with her best friend – and she stills works with both of them! Their kids are now training to take over the business. I was like, "Oh my god, this is a reality TV show."

I originally sold the show in a different format to Bravo, but when I left Bravo, I took it back. SallyAnn reformatted it and came up with a better concept than what I had. It was just going to be a pilot at first, but of course, given the powerhouse that she is, she made it go straight to series. We're super excited. It's going to connect to viewers like *The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills* and *Vanderpump Rules*. It's a show you can keep watching for two hours straight.

So you knew Lisa before you started developing the show?

Stanger: She's someone I work with on a regular basis. All matchmakers work with me; we all work with each other. What's great about this show is that you're going to see this unveiling of the industry. You're going to see behind the scenes of matchmaking, which is a real business that you cannot major in at college. The only place you can get certification is through my old assistant who owns the Matchmakers Institute in New York. You train with matchmakers. You shadow them, like other matchmakers have shadowed me. It's cool because it's always handed down generation after generation – the way Lisa plans on handing it down to her daughter Annie.

A lot of crazy things happen in these episodes, a lot of cliff-hanger drama. And I'm appearing in a lot of episodes, which is fun.

SallyAnn, you've produced a lot of shows about love and relationships. What do you think makes this one different?

Salsano: It's actually real. There's something about a family dynamic that you can't change. If you combine the young and beautiful people on *Vanderpump Rules* with the drama of *Flipping Out* and the family dynamic of *Cake Boss*, then you get *Love Blows* – this show has it all. And it's all coming from a place of helping other people find love.

Mixing Patti's star power and expertise with their family dynamic is a recipe for success. Still, there's a lot of disastrous moments behind the scenes too. It's the stuff that reality shows are made of – and it's completely authentic.

Shifting gears, let's talk about digital matchmaking versus traditional matchmaking. Do you think singles are ready to get back to true matchmaking – where a matchmaker (instead of a website or app) sets them up on a date?

Stanger: Personal attention will never be defeated by an app. Ever! With a matchmaker, you have someone selecting potential partners for you and talking to you on a daily basis…versus an app that has no information! You don't even know how tall they are, how many kids they have, if they're divorced. That's why matchmaking is older than prostitution – it's as old as time.

Do you think the show could help bring back the matchmaking industry?

Stanger: I wanted to make it a major in college — where you could actually major in it and open your own business. The industry is really going to change in the next 10 years. We've already passed the two billion dollar mark — internationally, not just in the United States.

We've never been able to use FaceTime matchmaking because people want to hide their looks, their voices, their age, their height, and their weight. So that's the next frontier: Will you FaceTime with somebody? Will you show them who you are in broad daylight without makeup on and your hair up?

That's brilliant! Getting back to the show, Patti, we'd love to know a bit more about your role on-camera.

Stanger: You see a little bit of a softer side of me. I come in to help Annie, and I have to shut Lisa down because Lisa's more of a screamer than I am in this particular season. On top of it, I go on three dates.

I'm still going to lose my cool because I'm Patti, but I'm not

in charge, so it's a different side of me. It's hard because I'm used to calling the shots. I'm more like the therapist that comes in to fix the problems in the family.

I have a couple additional questions for you, SallyAnn. The last time we spoke, I asked you if there would be a reunion for the *Jersey Shore* cast...and then *Reunion Road Trip* happened!

Salsano: That had nothing to do with me. Oh my god, I would kill to do one — with the entire cast and have them talk about the past.

As you probably know, Ronnie Ortiz-Magro and Pauly D have both been on the show *Famously Single*. Have you watched it?

Salsano: Of course. I watch this show and everything those cast members do. We have a group text going, and we always support each other. They're like my children. They call me "Mom." It makes me feel 900 years old, but it is what it is! There's something different when you know somebody before anyone else did. I think you just kind of have a different bond with them and different insight into who they are.

Any final words about Love Blows?

Salsano: Just watch it!

Stanger: You need to watch it live. We have this expression on WE tv: "Live or Die." You're going to get tips about what to do if you want to open your own business, if you're dating someone and it's not working out, if you want to get back in the game after a divorce. People date on Saturdays or Sundays, so they need to tune in on Friday night! They need to have these tips in their arsenal. We can basically be your dating coaches.

As a clinical social worker, Dr. Darcy strives to help individuals open up and communicate in order to receive the most fulfilling romantic relationships possible. In our recent <u>celebrity interview</u>, Dr. Darcy revealed some of the drama that went down on this season, key relationship issues, and how her show has helped her own marriage.

Since the show essentially revolves around relationships, it's not a surprise that several co-stars ended up dating both during and after filming. Former *Jersey Shore* star Ronnie Ortiz-Magro and *DASH Dolls* alum Malika Haqq did not shy away from sharing details on their relationship on social media, but broke up shortly after filming ended. "I think they needed to learn how to have a fight. They had different communication styles, they needed to learn how to resolve conflict, and they needed to learn how to communicate effectively," Dr. Darcy says. She even confessed that her and wife Stephanie Koncicki offered to coach them after the show had ended, but Ronnie wasn't interested.

his love with model Zoe Baron. When asked whether or not Dr. Darcy thinks Chad has learned much from the show, she informed us that the couple had very recently broken up! "They broke up two nights ago, so you tell me," she says.

And when it comes down to Calum Best, who was also on the show last season, Dr. Darcy explained that it was much easier to get deep down and solve his relationship conflicts. "The amazing thing with Calum is that I got to go so much deeper with him because I already had a relationship established with him, so I didn't have to earn trust or build a foundation of a relationship," Dr. Darcy says. "I'm a little rough on Calum this season."

The Advice Dr. Darcy Gives Is As Real As It Gets

As a licensed psychologist, Dr. Darcy also has her own group practice in addition to an advice column. At times, it can be up for debate whether or not the advice she gives is the same she'd give to her private clients – but she quickly shuts that down. "You have to start with the basic skills – communication skills, conflict skills, how to have a fight. Those are the biggest issues."

She explains that regardless of whether she's counseling in private or in the public eye on television, it is of great importance that individuals are working on their communication and conflict resolution. "We need them with all of our relationships. I need them with my friends, family, even my clients."

Dr. Darcy further emphasized the fact that feelings get hurt in relationships, and it's somehow inevitable. "We need to know how to have a fight, and how to communicate when someone's hurt our feelings because in relationships, we hurt each other's feelings," she says. "Everyone does it."

Famously Single Improved Her Marriage

Dr. Darcy married her partner, Stephanie, in 2009. She mentioned that Stephanie also does relationship counseling, but coaches couples together, whereas Dr. Darcy prefers oneon-one. "We teach relationship skills all the time. We're incredibly mindful of practicing what we preach, and it's really enhanced our relationship," Dr. Darcy disclosed.

The two even have an online course together called "Relationship Skills Bootcamp." The workshop is designed to teach participants to improve skills within their relationship, similarly to the way their face-to-face counseling is.

Having made her television debut on E! in 2011, the network was familiar with her, so she flew out, auditioned, and the rest is history. Her experience as a licensed clinical social worker and relationship expert facilitates her work to help individuals and couples who want more out of life. She hosts workshops focused on psychology and runs a Q&A blog. In our exclusive celebrity interview, Dr. Darcy dishes on the *Famously Single* cast members, from who was her favorite to who surprised her the most, and shares her best <u>relationship advice</u>.

Dr. Darcy Dishes On *Famously Single* Cast In This Celebrity Interview

In the latest celebrity news, before filming the show began, Dr. Darcy reveals that she was most concerned about working with Jersey Shore star Pauly D. "Based on what I knew of him, which was very little, he's a big prankster always making wise cracks. I thought he was going to be the difficult, oppositional child in the classroom," the social worker shares. "He actually turned out to be one of my favorites! Not that a mom really has favorites, but he was a delight to work with. He came in so earnest and really showed up with an openness to the process that made it so easy to work with him." However, now that she's finished filming the show, Dr. Darcy says that Somaya Reece surprised her the most. On the show, Reece shared her story of domestic abuse and became a poster child for resilience. "How she bounced back from that was mind-boggling," Dr. Darcy says. "It speaks to human resilience and she is such an inspiration."

The main premise of the reality TV series is to teach relationship skills to celebrities who are infamous for being single. But since filming ended, the celebrities who have the best chance of finding love after this experience are those who were able to learn about themselves. "Those celebs that walked away learning about themselves, taking personal responsibility, recognizing that they've made mistakes in the past that having nothing to do with being famous are the ones who have the best chance at finding love," the therapist says. While being famous supersizes relationship problems, notoriety doesn't create problems that didn't pre-exist. With Dr. Darcy leading the group therapy sessions, these celebs can't use fame as the reason for their relationship issues. "The fact that they're famous is not justification for why they're single," the psychologist shares. After discussing their issues and teaching them relationship skills, the celebrities have had a chance to practice these skills through interacting with each other and mock dates.

The <u>celebrity couple</u> who made the biggest splash in the headlines was Brandi Glanville and Calum Best, who began dating on the show. Although their courtship has ended, Dr. Darcy says both celebrities have learned a lot about themselves from the experience. "Brandi is much more aware of certain things she's done and Calum has thrown himself into yoga, which is major progress for him," she adds. "The show wasn't meant to create long-term sustainable change, though. It was intended to provoke a level of awareness in everyone and ignite a desire in each individual to go on their own journey and do their own work." After working with the celebs, the therapist says that Glanville does tend to pick the wrong people for her, but that there is a reason she's attracted to certain types of people. "Brandi has done a lot of work on herself and her work's not done," she says. After all is said and done, Dr. Darcy said filming Famously Single was an amazing and challenging experience, saying, "I would love a second season."

Reality TV Therapist Shares Best Relationship Advice

From filming a hit reality TV show to managing time with her clients, Dr. Darcy has a busy schedule. However, she knows that her relationship needs to be her top priority. "You cannot give everything you have away at work," she says. "You have to come home with a little reserved. It's unacceptable to come home on empty." The reality TV therapist says that

relationships require work every single day and that it's a fallacy that relationships "shouldn't feel like work." If you're struggling to manage your relationship and busy lifestyle, think back to what created your relationship. Think back to the beginning when you courted, seduced, supported, encouraged, and admired your partner. After the honeymoon phase, relationships are about self-discipline. "You have to incorporate it into your everyday life," Dr. Darcy says. "This is the person you want to show up most for, not the least." In her own relationship with her wife Stephanie, it is all about self-care. The duo makes sure they are highly involved with hobbies, such as yoga, dance, meditation, and CrossFit. "Steph and I try to walk the walk," she shares. "There have been times when we haven't engaged in the level of self-care we need to and our clients reflect that. They don't absorb the information if we don't walk the walk."

The most important skill to maintaining a healthy relationship is communication. "You have to be willing to listen to your partner, even when you're tired and feel like they're picking on you," Dr. Darcy says. It is crucial that you actively listen, remain guiet, and control the impulse to be defensive. You have to mirror back and paraphrase what they said so they know you listened to them and you know you understood. Most of the time, your partner just wants to be heard. "If you can deliver that to your partner, you have a basis of a great relationship," she says. Once you learn the basic relationship skills, all of your relationships will improve because you will use these same skills with your family and friends. "I really hope people are motivated to learn about relationship skills because the quality of our lives is predicated on the quality of our relationships," Dr. Darcy reveals. "It's the most important thing in our lives and nobody teaches us." At

the end of the day, the best love advice from Dr. Darcy is the metaphor: "Use the good china every night." Relationships are about showing up for your partner the same way you would for a stranger or company that you're trying to impress. Make every day a date and bring romance into everything you do.



in a world where being gay is the norm and being straight, like they are, is looked down upon. Although Griffin plays the antagonist and is not the most likable character, he says the script was innovative and featured a fascinating concept that he had never seen before. "When you take the universal story of falling in love, on top of the flipping of the worlds, and combine all of the talented people I worked with, it turns into a dynamite movie," he says.

The film is inspired by true events, and each person involved with the movie had a mission to tell a story that would change people's lives. In order to prepare for a dynamic and complex role like Bill Bradley, Griffin did a lot of research including reading articles and watching videos. "I didn't want to play a stereotype or archetype of a bully," he explains. "I wanted to play it truthfully and figure out why somebody would have these hateful feelings for another person."

But it wasn't entirely imagination that helped the actor prepare for his role. "I certainly, like most people, have had situations in my life where I was excluded," he shares. So when he saw someone being bullied, he would always try to stick up for the other kids. "It is essential for the story that the character be played truthfully so people can learn from it," he says. "We have to ask ourselves why Bill Bradley is taking the action he's taking. He is told by some extreme forces in the world about intolerance and hate, and those forces exist in our world too."

Love Is All You Need shows people how to resist that negativity and recognize that everyone wants to live their life being who they are without persecution. "If love is your guide, you can't go wrong," he says. "When we divide each other, that's when we fail. But when we come together, that's when we do great things."

While the movie tackles some serious societal issues, that doesn't mean the cast and crew didn't have a blast making the film. Griffin and co-star Emily Osment had Pop Tart eating competitions, while he and Briana Evigan would play basketball during the night shoots. "I'm closer to this cast than I have been with any other cast I've worked with," Griffin says. "We all became a family."

Love Is All You Need directly addresses current controversies of discrimination and diversity. Recently, Hollywood has been under scrutiny since #OscarsSoWhite started trending. Griffin believes that Hollywood directors need to seek out a diverse cast in their films. "We're telling stories about the world, and the world is diverse, so the stories we tell should be just as diverse," he says.

Even with all his success, there are always doubters when it comes to the talents of mediums. "Thankfully, every celebrity who agreed to have their session filmed was open in some capacity, even the skeptics," he shares. Henry says that he communicates what the client is meant to hear, not necessarily what they want to hear, and of course, that requires some tact.

Despite all of the celebrities he has had the opportunity to work with, if he had the chance to read anyone in the world, it would be the Dalai Lama. "To be able to connect to such an influential, and inspiring person would be an absolute honor," he gushes.

In his personal life, the medium admits that his gift doesn't cause too many relationship problems. "I'm one of the few people who can probably tell whether or not there's going to be a second date before the first one," he says with a laugh. When it comes to his celebrity crush, he admits, "Ezra Miller, hands down!"

The greatest piece of relationship advice he has to offer is for those with a significant other on the other side: "Honor their legacy by having new and exciting experiences and look for the signs they will give to show they are still with you," he explains. "They also want you to be open to new relationships and love."

The heartache of losing a significant other is unimaginable, and the pain of losing a child is even harder for people to accept. Henry has these words for grieving parents: "Children are met by loved ones on the other side and are helped in their transition with ease," he says. "Every child that I've ever brought through has acknowledged being at peace with God."

What many people don't know is that the celebrity clairvoyant had a near-death experience of his own. "In February 2014, I suffered brain swelling due to water on the brain caused by a brain cyst," he reveals. He had emergency brain surgery and was in the intensive care unit for days. "It was life-changing for me – nothing quite grounds you like a near-death experience," he shares in our celebrity interview. "It showed me what really matters and just how fragile life in this realm can be."

As for what's next for Henry, he plans to continue doing readings and even has a book in the works. He would love to travel and tour the world. "I have so many causes that I hope to be able to bring light to, particularly in grief awareness and support for parents who experience the loss of a child," he says. Last fall, he went through some tough times and battled depression, and the comedian credits his ex-wife for helping him get through it.

Brady confirms that his relationship with Taketa (who was sitting next to him with daughter Maile during our interview) works for a simple reason: "We love each other. We truly love each other – like back to the wall, fight anybody, like I can say something about her, but you can't because I will fight you, and she will kill you for me," he explains. "So we have love and friendship. Add to that that we are parents together and business partners in this beautiful venture of a child." Given his experience, he doesn't understand the people who can't be friends, love each other, and happily co-exist because, at the end of the day, they are still a family.

The comedian shares that he's happily single at the moment. "I tried dating in the past, and it's not that I don't want to or won't, but now is not the time," he says. "I'm enjoying my life. I've got my daughter; I get to hang out with my best friend; and I get to do amazing work. I'll get around to it at some point."
