
Celebrity News: Michael Bublé Talks Toll Touring Takes on His Marriage



The 37-year-old star says that married life to Argentine actress **Luisana Lopilato** is wonderful but admits their busy careers sometimes kept them apart.



1. Destination wedding: This may be expensive, but why not go all out? Everyone can meet up and take a cruise through the tropics while you two exchange vows at sea.




 Cost: Weddings can get very expensive, so if you're skimping on parts of the reception to afford that second dress, it may not be worth it.
