While filming *Cruel Intentions*, she began exploring an off-set celebrity romance with co-star Ryan Phillippe, whom she first met at her 21st birthday party. The couple married in 1999 and welcomed two children together: daughter Ava Elizabeth and son

Deacon Reese. As the actress continued to soar in her career, she landed the role that made her a household name: Elle Woods in Legally Blonde, a surprise box office success. She soon proved her true talents in Walk the Line as country singer June Carter Cash. The film was a critical and commercial success, earning her an Academy Award and Golden Globe Award for her work. As her professional life was at its peak, her personal one was not doing so well. Witherspoon and Phillippe announced their separation in 2006 and filed for celebrity divorce the next year.

Since then, Reese Witherspoon has appeared in several films, including Rendition, Penelope, Four Christmases, and Water for Elephants, starring next to heartthrobs like Jake Gyllenhaal, Vince Vaughn, and Robert Pattinson.
