'Design Star' Champion Leslie Ezelle Offers Relationship Advice for a Happy Home

This season of HGTV's 'Design Star' showcased former contestants vying for the winning spot one more time. After her participation in season six, Leslie Ezelle returned with her eyes on the prize. And in the dramatic finale episode, which aired August 21st, her focus paid off: she won the \$25,000 prize and an appearance on an HGTV show. The interior designer, breast cancer survivor, former Dallas Cowboy's cheerleader and mother of a blended family has a lot on her plate, but she isn't letting anything get in her way.

Ezelle says she thrives off her design career. She has been producing her own design clips since her first round on 'Design Star' in hopes of getting her own show. Her personal home remodeling, coupled with her lessons in how to "tame your domain," has been keeping her busy, and she says she'd love to use television as a means of sharing her ideas and helping others find solace in their home.

"I'm producing a little show now called *The Real Modern Family*," she says. "I'm currently three months behind schedule and it's been very stressful having my family as my clients and taking input from the kids! Whenever these type of things come up, I'm swamped from the beginning of the day to the end of the day."

Despite these struggles, Ezelle says her life doesn't get in the way of her family. Her "tame your domain" theory comes from the connections she has found between design and everyday life. According to Ezelle, "your energy comes from your home, and design plays a huge role in that. Your home is in direct correlation to your family — if you have a kitchen that works physically and if you have a dining room that works with that kitchen, then you have a great space to spend time together."

Ezelle and her wife Libby don't always agree on design though. Ezelle has a more contemporary style, while Libby prefers traditional decor. The pair combat this difference with "sweetness," Ezelle says, a method they learned from a relationship expert on a couples' retreat. Leslie encourages couples building a home together — whether new or old — to remember that physical belongings are solely physical. "If you have a happy relationship with your spouse and you're trying to blend your style, the best thing to do each night is to compliment each other," she advises. "Instead of using criticizing words, you just have to be diplomatic and remember that you're talking to someone who you love. You're trying to blend styles — why would you want to be critical and mean?

That does zero good."

The design star has three pieces of advice for couples looking to blend their style:

- 1. Write down your must-haves, and share them with each other.
- 2. Design is not just about having pretty things in your house. It's about having a home that is a reflection of your lifestyle.
- 3. Practice talking to each other like strangers and being sweet and polite. You have to maintain that level of respect and be mindful of each others' feelings.

Design has helped Ezelle with more than just her family life. In 2008, she was diagnosed with breast cancer — a rollercoaster involving six weeks of radiation and two years of reconstructive surgeries that left her embittered. " I didn't struggle with breast cancer; I struggled through treatment," she shares. "I didn't feel sexy; I felt weak, broken down and bitter. I kept saying, 'I'm not a victim,' and I was really angry."

But she took her mother's advice in pursuing her design career and made it on to 'Design Star.' "When you're going through something bad," remarks Ezelle, "you can't see why you're going through it. It became clear to me when I got on the show. I never would've auditioned for the show had I not gotten breast cancer. I said, 'I can't let my breast cancer be what's motivating me.'"

After competing on 'Design Star, Ezelle connected with Courtney Arbour, a marketing manager for Susan G. Komen, and together, they came up with the idea that "you can't strap a good woman down" — a sculpture of a metal bra crawling the tree of life.

Ezelle's sculpture, Ann-e Girl, which was named after her children's aunt who passed away from breast cancer, travelled around Texas, turning buildings pink for the day and raising awareness. "This was my way of embracing breast cancer rather than being angry about it," proclaims the designer. "The inner strength you gain from pursuing your goals is where you get your empowerment. If you're not going after your dreams, you won't feel sexy; you won't feel powerful; and you won't feel like a woman."

While design may have helped her cope with the ups and downs of life, Ezelle's real comfort is in her family. "The relationships I have my wife and my children completely outweigh everything else," she says. "Design, work, cancer — it's our love that matters."

"By massaging your partner, you will feel reconnected again. I think it's a really nice, sweet thing you can do to become attached to your partner again."

It looks like Muriel Villera, 21, of Hialeah, Florida, took Rivero's advice to heart. Last night, she was crowned this season's winner. She believes that her personality played as big of a role in her success as her beautiful face and perfect figure, recently saying, "There is nothing more attractive than ambition and confidence." Next stop for this Latina? A move to New York City to use what she learned on the show and focus on her modeling career.

While Muriel hopes to be a positive example for aspiring models, Rivero believes that women get the wrong impression from this industry, often thinking that they need to be as skinny as them or that they need surgery to look a certain way. She argues that men are generally attracted to women who are natural, so instead of trying to cover up, just be confident with you you are. Recognizing the great influence that models have on women everywhere, she says, "I think we can inspire women by being healthy and in shape and showing off our bodies with confidence."

As for finding that self-confidence, Rivero thinks that "finding a balance," both physically and emotionally, is the most important step. She tells us that she's learned to live her life by being optimistic and trying to find the good in all situations. "Confidence comes from having joy inside you, not necessarily by the way you look in the mirror," she shares.

As for the secret to her lasting relationship? Communication. Rivero says she and Mora know how to respect each other's space and to always talk through their issues. Judge Lynn Toler of 'Divorce Court' Says Katie Holmes and Tom Cruise Had "Too Much to Lose By Dragging Out Their Divorce"

Earlier this week, Katie Holmes and Tom Cruise signed their divorce settlement, reaching an agreement faster than most Hollywood couples. While details of the arrangement remain private, sources say that Suri, the couple's six-year-old daughter, will live in New York with her mother, while her father will have generous visitation rights.

In order to better understand the ins-and-outs of this process, we spoke with Judge Lynn Toler, who hosts 'Divorce Court,' the longest-running court show on television. Since 2006, Judge Toler has brought both tenacity and compassion to the courtroom, focusing on the relationship at hand and dispensing helpful advice to real litigants.

The media has paid much attention to the role of Scientology in Holmes's decision to divorce Cruise. And for good reason, according to Judge Toler. While it's not something that she sees frequently in her courtroom, she understands why it's very intense when it does happen. "Religion doesn't often have a role in divorce cases, but when it does, it is very difficult to deal with because people's beliefs aren't something you can really compromise on."

Another point of interest in this divorce case is Holmes's request for full-custody of Suri. Judge Toler, though, isn't surprised by her bold approach. "She knew what she wanted, and she moved quickly and decisively. I think that she asked for what she wanted because of the concerns that she had for her daughter."

She adds, "After all, isn't that a mother's job?"

In a joint statement, Holmes and Cruise said that they are doing whatever they can to keep Suri's best interests in mind. By agreeing to the terms of their divorce in such a rapid manner, Judge Toler believes that they already did a

tremendous thing for their daughter. "Sometimes, the best thing you can do for your children is to *not* get everything you want. Tom gave up legal custody but settled for generous visitation rights."

While it may seem like Cruise should fight for more time with his daughter, Judge Toler supports the resolution to their custody battle. "You have to ask yourself if dividing their time between you and your ex is the best thing for you or the best thing for your kids," she explains. "Children need a stable environment, some place they can call home where the rules are always the same."

Perhaps the most surprising part of this celebrity divorce is the swiftness of their settlement. "I believe that both of them had too much to lose by dragging it out," Judge Toler explains. "I also believe that the church of Scientology didn't want to get involved with it, which certainly would've happened. Tom didn't want to expose himself or his church to that kind of scrutiny."

Next up for Holmes and Cruise: They will present their settlement to the courts and wait for it to be approved before they'll be grated a divorce decree. Judge Toler doesn't foresee any future issues though, explaining that "the courts love when couples settle as quickly and amicably as these two. They really like the parties to come to a resolution on their own."

As for any advice for the pair as their divorce continues to play out, Judge Toler says she has none. "I think they're doing it right! They didn't let their emotions get ahead of what they needed to do. I say continue on and good luck."

"I want to go to war with any designer that has a thin, 16-year-old girl walk down the runway, who inadvertently encourages young girls around the world to put their finger down their mouth because they think they have to weigh 116 pounds," he says. "The average woman is 5'4 and 143 pounds.

That is beautiful. That is sexy!"

Expanding on this idea, Fisher believes that the fashion industry has created a false picture of what a woman should look like. Through The Network and his work on *Remodeled*, he inspires his female and male models to be confident and healthy in an industry that scrutinizes their every feature. The powerhouse agent knows that self-esteem issues caused by magazines and designers extends to real women everywhere.

"This isn't a business to me. It's a movement, and you're a part of my movement. I'm really working, with every fiber of my being, to change the industry," he reveals. Your physical reality is irrelevant anyways."

Despite his work in an industry that focuses on appearance above all else, Fisher believes that looks aren't everything. "I've dated the most beautiful women in the world, and I've lived with the most beautiful woman in the world," he says. "Yes, physical attraction is important, but much more important is being on the same path spiritually, wanting the same things as far as giving back to the world and truly trying to make a difference."

Fisher is looking for a woman in his personal life who is beautiful inside and out. "About two years ago, right before I was supposed to get married, I got dumped by my beautiful fiancée, and I have not been with anyone since then."

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Exclusive Interview: 'Million Dollar Listing's' Josh Altman Says, "Relationships are Harder Than Owning a House"

Thanks to Bravo's reality television hit *Million Dollar Listing*, viewers have gotten an inside peek at the high-end real estate business. And thanks to the aggressive tactics of real estate agent Josh Altman — also known as "The Shark" — fans of the show know what it takes to make it in such a cutthroat industry. What they may not realize are the lessons in love that Altman learns from selling houses to bachelors, single women, new couples and divorcees alike. Luckily, in an exclusive interview with CupidsPulse.com, he shared some tricks of *both* trades: real estate and romance.

Altman, who works with the Beverly Hills firm Hilton & Hyland, has certainly found success in the Los Angeles real estate market. He recently sold a condominium on Ocean Drive for \$10.5 million, making it the highest sale in Santa Monica history.

"Everybody wants to know, 'What the hell do you get in a \$10.5 million condo in LA?' It's one thing in New York — everything is like \$10 million bucks," he says with a laugh. "But in LA, you get 8,000 square feet of 360-degree views. Plus, you get an 8,000 square foot rooftop deck. It's absolutely incredible."

He continues, "On one side, you have the entire coast, and then you turn around, and you have Hollywood Hills. It was the most spectacular condo I've ever seen."

Of course, most people cannot afford such an expensive home. Even so, regardless of the price tag, everyone approaches house hunting from a different perspective, with single people and couples perhaps having the most distinctive viewpoints.

"It's two totally different ballgames," says Altman. "Most bachelors love to have a nice, plush movie theater. They want the cool, outdoor pool and entertaining area too."

Couples, on the other hand, have a much more standard focus. "For couples, it's always about the kitchen and the bathrooms. Always," Altman explains. "They want to make sure there is a fence outside and not too many stairs inside, so it's safer if they decide to have kids."

He adds, "It's a lot of fun seeing both sides of it."

Unfortunately, couples can sometimes struggle to compromise

when it comes to buying a new home. Just like all aspects of dating and maintaining a relationship, both parties must learn to give and take a bit. "You've got to find a happy medium," Altman recommends. "But if there's too much argument and they end up buying a house, there's a good chance that I'll get two more sales out of it when they divorce!"

Taking his advice a step further, he shares, "I believe that a couple should sit down and each person should come up with a list of the top five to ten things that they want in a house. Then, they can put their lists together and kind of meet halfway. As long as both sides get two to four things that they want, they can both be happy."

It may sound straightforward, but in truth, even deciding how big of a house to buy — for either a bachelor or a couple — can be a daunting task. For a single woman, it's often tempting to plan for the future and buy a home suitable for a family.

However, Altman cautions against this plan. "Sure, she may be a wealthy girl who can afford a big house that would be great for the future, but it can be intimidating for the guy," he says. "He's going over to his girlfriend's big, beautiful house, and then he's going home to his not-so-big-and-beautiful house."

And the same challenge holds true for couples. "If you get too small of a house, you may be on top of each other. Everybody needs their space, so that can be a disaster," Altman explains. "But at the same time, if you have too big of a house, it's a different type of disaster and can lead to financial troubles or difficulty with upkeep."

For couples just moving in together, Altman believes it is best to test the waters first and move into one of their current homes. If you take things slow, there's less chance that you'll end up with a broken heart. "It's easy to buy or

sell a house and not so easy to fall in love," he says.

Some couples, though, are trying to escape from romantic ghosts, so moving into a new house is the best option. "I run into a lot of my clients who are either remarried or still living in a house from a previous relationship, and they want to sell. They want to start from scratch — you know, the new boyfriend doesn't want to be in the same house as the old guy," Altman says.

"It makes sense: they want a fresh start. They want to move on from the memories, and that's the best way to do it," he adds.

As much as Altman's learned about real estate from his clients, he's also picked up a few house-buying tips from his own experiences. When asked about buying his first house, he says one word comes to mind: scary. "I bought my first house in 2002, and it seemed like a huge amount of money, especially when you're borrowing from a bank," he shares. "The whole process is overwhelming, which is why it's so important to have the right realtor who can walk you through everything."

Since then, Altman has bought a new house every year or so. He explains, "I don't like to stay in the same place very long because I get bored. Most of the time, I'll fix something up and then sell it."

He also knows firsthand the importance of buying a house of the right size. A couple of years ago, he owned a house that was about 6,000 square feet. He says, "It ended up taking up all of my time. It was just too much."

Keeping in mind both his business and personal experiences, Altman boils down his opinion to one simple statement: "Relationships are a lot harder than owning a house!"
