

Blondie recently talked to us about her experience on the show, giving us some behind-the-scenes insight. She also shared a bit of hairstyle advice when it comes to date night or a break-up as well as what hair trends to expect this fall.

What influenced you to leave your salon to compete on the show?

The girls I worked with. They are all younger than me and kept pushing me to do it. They thought it would be a great experience, which it was. As a business owner, you must be able to take risks and know when to take them, and I felt this was the right time.

Was the show what you expected it would be?

I didn't know what to expect before I went on. It taped in six weeks, and I was only allowed to make one phone call home per week for just five minutes, so that was hard since I was away from my husband and son.

Why did you decide to do "show" hair when so many stylists shy away from doing up-dos, let alone extravagant hairdos like you do on the show?

I never really decided to do "fantasy" hair. I'm a colorist now, but I started my business by doing bridal parties and going on-site for big events. I love up-dos, but I never had experience with fantasy hair, so it was completely new to me. Other contestants knew how to use materials and techniques that I didn't, but I learned things along the way and got the hang of it.

How did it feel being in the final four?

I had mixed emotions. At that point, I was very homesick. If I had to go home, I wouldn't have minded, and I would have been happy knowing I tried my best. But I wasn't surprised I made it (not to sound over-confident). I just feel that I'm a great hairdresser, and I was confident in my abilities even though I didn't have as much experience as the other contestants.

I would say a change is definitely in order but I wouldn't recommend something too drastic. If you chop it all off, it will cost a pretty penny to get extensions to try and mend the situation. A different color will give you that instant boost after a break-up. Are there any tricks of the trade you can share with us to help women out there look fabulous even if they can't hit the salon as often as they wish?

I'd suggest women allow their hair to air dry the night before and then go over it with a round brush and blow dryer in the morning. It will be easier to blow out and isn't as bad as when your hair is soaking wet.

What major trends are you seeing this fall?



RHOBH EXCLUSIVE: Taylor Armstrong's Life Coach, Melanie Mar Answers Our Questions

Last Monday night, the world was introduced to Melanie Mar on The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills (RHOBH). As we all saw, she was giving life coaching advice to Taylor Armstrong and helping her through her marriage woes to her now late husband, Russell. We published an interview with Melanie the day after the episode aired, where she offered advice for both couples looking to strengthen their relationship and singles searching for Mr. Right. This week, Melanie shares insight with us that answers our burning questions about the Armstrong's, what it was like to work with Taylor, and what type of counsel she gave to her over the past six months.

We loved watching you on the show. Can you tell us a little about your history with the Armstrong's and how you came to be Taylor's life coach?

I've known the Armstrong's for about a year now. We met through mutual friends. Initially I was brought into the RHOBH to help resolve the marital problems of both Russell and Taylor. However prior to filming, Taylor privately disclosed personal details (since made public) within the marriagewhich made it unprofessional for me to counsel them as a couple on the show. It was my opinion and suggestion that I would be most beneficial as Taylor's life coach.

How long have you been a coach to Taylor?

Our first session began in March. I found her to be very forthcoming and open. This is an incredibly important characteristic as it enables me to assist the person with understanding what they want and don't want in their lives and relationships. Once I have established that, we can begin the process of putting in place the actions needed for change. Pain indicates change is needed or change is in progress.

What were you doing to help Taylor and her marriage? What were your sessions like?

As with all my clients, I begin with educating a different way to communicate within relationships. I teach the biological differences of men's and women's brains and why they think and feel things differently. Ultimately, if a relationship is beyond repair I then have to progress onto alternative options available for that individual or couple and help them to make the best rational, logical decision depending on their circumstances.

On the episode it appeared that you were trying to help Taylor with her marriage, not sway her to leave like the rest of the women were convincing her to do. Can you tell us more about that?

I work with what I have. If someone tells me they will do anything to make their marriage work, then I will do my utmost to give them all the tools, information and support necessary to make it possible. If someone tells me they want to leave their marriage, I will give them all the tools, information and support to make it possible. I cannot tell anyone what to do – they have to tell me what they want to do and my job then is to assist them in getting there.

According to reports, Taylor and Russell were also being

counseled by psychiatrist Dr. Charles Sophy. Did you work with him?

I have not worked with Dr Charles Sophy. Unlike psychiatrists, I am not licensed to prescribe medication. What I teach is a form of cognitive behavior therapy. I am working with the left lobe of the brain responsible for making logical decisions. Most people regret something they have said or done when it has come from a state of being irrational, emotional or illogical. I help people deal with conflict in their life, whether it's with loved ones, friends, co-workers or family, in a rational way.

What counsel do you provide someone who is not only having relationship and communication problems, but domestic violence issues as well?

My advice to anyway suffering from domestic violence is to contact the experts who specialize in domestic abuse cases.

How is Taylor now? Are you still her life coach?

I have not seen Taylor since the funeral, but she knows I am here for her when she is ready to talk privately.

What are some reasons a person would hire a life coach?

Everybody needs to talk to someone during trials — it is unhealthy to suffer in silence. However, most people, particularly women, who share their intimate problems do so with several people. This causes more confusion because everyone is giving different and uneducated advice. I am unbiased and am certified in what I do. My coaching is based on scientific studies. I teach specific tools to enable my clients to take control of their life, to get what they want by knowing what they don't want.

If someone wanted to hire you to coach them in the same way

you did Taylor, what would that look like? What's the process?

My first session with a client starts with me explaining my qualifications, who I am and what I do. I give a brief background into the brain and why men and women do, say and behave in certain ways. I ask what their particular problem is and then begin teaching the behavior modification techniques. In each session after that, we continue working together on their issues, implementing the tools and following up on their progress. Other than coaching, I offer complete makeovers. As a former runway and photographic model, fashion and style are paramount to me. Rosenberg can attest to that, having served as a matchmaker and relationship expert on season three of *The Bachelor*. "I worked behind-the-scenes in regards to seeking out the right bachelorettes for the show. I actually interviewed Bob the Bachelor," she reveals.

Reality TV or not, the dating expert can shine a light in the dark corners of an individual's personality and help them truly find what — and who — they are looking for. She explains, "When most people come to me, they look pretty darn amazing in person and on paper. They believe that they like who they are, and in many ways, when we're talking about the ego, they *do* like who they are."

Rosenberg expands on this expert love advice and adds, "However, they come to me believing that the issue isn't really about them but rather about finding the right person. During my beginning assessment process, people begin to realize that they never knew who they were and that they became the person they were told to be or taught to be by society. Therefore, they're not only attracted *to* the wrong people, but they're also *attracting* the wrong people."

With this thought in mind, her first priority is to teach people who they truly are. "After I finally introduce and match my client with their true self, then we can get down to who this person should be dating. We've put over 200 marriages together and haven't had one divorce, which is just crazy and unheard of," she shares. "I think it's because these people are connecting on a genuine level that most people never have the opportunity to experience."

Revealing how important her work is to her, Rosenberg gushes from the other end of the phone, "It's much more than matchmaking to me."

The relationship expert knows that, in order to find love, her client must be a healthy-minded person. They have to be in a place where they are self-aware and know that what they've been doing isn't working. This kind of acknowledgement tends to set the mind for positive experiences, whether they're an everyday person or a celebrity. For example, a radiant and successful woman with everything going for her, like Jennifer Aniston, will still have problems keeping a man if she doesn't have this mind set.

In fact, speaking of Aniston, Rosenberg says, "I do have clients that know her and say she's lovely. However, there is a very apparent trend in her love life. She is darling, and there is so much to like about her, but there is something going on with her, something that she needs to pay attention to. She needs to get down to the reality of what it is that she is doing. What is surfacing in her relationships after a certain level of intimacy, and what unhealthy pattern she keeps accepting into her life? I really think that's what it comes down to for her."

The Highs and Lows of Celebrity Couple Clients

Celebrity relationships, media, and technology can be a dangerous mix. Rosenberg says that there are people, like Kim Kardashian, who are being followed around by a camera and dealing with sensationalism in every aspect of their love lives. Then on a real-world level, we have people using Facebook, Twitter and other social networking platforms to post every detail about their relationships — from happy pictures of the good times to angry rants detailing a harsh fight or break-up.

"The reality is that they're publicizing who they are as well as their personal relationships, and when you act this way, people are going to look at you and scrutinize you – the good and the bad," the dating expert explains. "As a couple, you need to be a team and understand that all that matters is what you and your partner know to be the truth."

Rosenberg then adds, "If there is something that is triggering a pain or disconnect from the outside based on what you read or see, that's something that you have to look within to understand. Couples need to be grounded in what love is really meant to be and not the attention it can bring."

Another fascinating component of the relationship expert business is what she refers to as a "life remodel." This particular piece caters to – but is not limited to – people in Maria Shriver's position. For people who have been cheated on and are struggling with a messy divorce, Rosenberg can bring a person back from the ashes and help them move on. "In a case like Maria's, there are always signs. We always have life poking at us with the truth, and it is up to us whether or not we want to see it," she says.


However, this mindset is easier said than done. "Sadly, most times, we choose to turn a blind eye to things that are not good for us, and eventually, it comes crashing down. Then, we no longer have power or control," says Rosenberg. "I think someone in Maria's situation would have to ask, 'Were there signs? How far back? Why did I choose to ignore them?' It is important for Maria to forgive herself and, as hard as it may sound, to forgive Arnold. The most amazing thing is that sometimes, from the deepest trenches of pain, we can end up finding the most amazing love we've ever had."

It always goes back to your past. "You have to look at your view on relationships, including that of your mother and father. What was your vision of love, and what is it now?," Rosenberg asks. "Focus on what loving you means as well as what is still good and precious in your life. Surround yourself with people who are truthful."

Finding Mr. Right

"I teach women to be ladies and men to be gentlemen," says model turned relationship coach, Melanie Mar who has worked with Hollywood's most elite celebrities and couples to help them find love in their life and more importantly, within themselves.

Melanie Mar is the founder of Melanie Mar International and a partner of Patti Stanger's Millionaire's Club Matchmaking Agency. You may also recognize her from last night's episode of *The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills*, where she is seen coaching Taylor Armstrong about her marriage to Russell Armstrong. We had the chance to catch up with Mar and get her advice for couples in a relationship, as well as for those who are navigating the single scene. She offered some amazing insight. Ladies take note.

One of the most common dating challenges for single women who live in big cities like LA or NY is that they find it too hard to meet a man. "Women have become much more independent and now they're competing with men," says Mar. "There's a lot of masculinity out there these days and it takes so much courage for today's man to approach today's woman. He has no idea what reaction he'll get," she explains.

Mar continues by noting that anytime women are working, it means they're using their left brain, which is their logical and doing mode, it's the one that's needed to do a job successfully. The opposite lobe is where our emotions lie. Interestingly, the left brain is also the lobe that men use, hence where the competitiveness comes into play.

"There are four people in every relationship because we're all masculine and we're all feminine. You know when you're being one or the other. In fact, one of the things that I tell my women [clients] when they're struggling with this is when you've finished work, come home and take one hour and do something feminine. I don't care if it's taking a bath, walking the dog, or playing music. I don't care what it is, but get into that feminine side."

A Harvard study on why we marry found that approximately twothirds of women marry for status and stability and the other 33 percent marry for sensual and sexual pleasure. However, the study found the exact opposite for men – where two-thirds of men marry for the sensual and sexual. When these men come home after work, they want to come home to a sensual home – meaning they don't want to work or compete once they've walked in the door.

"If you're a woman who wants a "real" man, turn it off when you get home," Mar advises. "It's so crucial to take that one hour — and you should tell your partner that you need to do this to become a better girlfriend, wife, or significant other. It's so important for women not to compete, control or conquer their men because you won't respect them and the men if they're real men, won't tolerate it. You'll be banging heads every time you open your mouth."

Mar's generously offered some tips for those looking to find that special someone:

- Stop going out in groups: It takes a lot of guts for a guy to approach a woman, much less a group of women. Mar advises if you're specifically going out to meet a guy, then don't go out with more than one girlfriend. If a man does approach you, remember to be nice to him even if you're not interested (unless he is a drunk or a creep of course!), since he mustered up a lot of courage to come talk to you.

- Make your body language very clear: Look around. Find a guy you're interested in. Make eye contact, hold it and SMILE. Melanie calls that "dropping the hanky" and men need a hanky dropped! It's very difficult for men to understand what women are doing so Mar always says to "drop the hanky," hold the look, smile, and be open and inviting because he's taking cues from your body signals.

– Do not sit there, huddled in a deep conversation with your girlfriends: Enough said.

– Do not go up to him: Let him come to you. And if he still doesn't approach you, then you know that you did your part. He's either in a relationship, not interested or gay.

- Keep the ball in his court: If he gives you his business card, turn it over, write your number on the back, and hand it back to him.

- Let him chase you: "That's another mistake today's woman is making," says Mar. "Women are calling, texting, inviting – making it far too easy for men. He doesn't want it to be that easy. He might think he does, but he doesn't. He wants to work for it."

- Flirt five times a day for five minutes: Practice on guys

that you're not interested in. Smile at a guy at Starbucks. Catch the eye of a guy in the grocery store. Wherever you go - practice. You may not be into them, but you're practicing flirting. Some of them will come up and want to talk to you, but that's more practice (just don't forget to be polite when exiting the conversation). Eventually, you'll see a guy who you like and it won't be difficult because you've done it so many times.

- Ask yourself what type of guy you like and go where they would go: If you want a business guy who is worldly then go to an elegant hotel bar like the side bar at Beverly Wilshire. If you want a younger person who is more hip, then go to a trendy restaurant like Boa. If you want a church guy, then go to church. Make sure you've answered these questions before you step out the door.

Not wanting to leave anyone out, Mar's also offered advice for those who are already in a relationship:

- Get a verbal contract: "I'm not a moralist, but when you decide to sleep with a guy, it does make a difference." Mar says that having a verbal contract is important so that you both are clear about what you're doing. "I don't care what that contract is. I don't care if you have one that says this is a one night stand but you need one. "There's nothing worse than a woman having sex with a man and presuming that they're in a monogamous relationship. Just because a woman spends a month or two getting to know a guy doesn't mean he isn't dating other people. A verbal contract will let you know where you stand so that you're both clear on your expectations.

- Negotiate time, sex, money and space: Take "time" for example. You say it's important to have a certain amount of time to yourself – negotiate with your partner how much time that is. For each of these categories, you should also negotiate "I," "We," and "Us." The "I" is time by yourself, the "We" is what you guys do together, and the "Us" is what you're doing together with other people. "It's really important to negotiate these things in order to keep the lines of communication open. If you do this, then the arguments are less and the peaceful atmosphere is more." Melanie advises couples to negotiate often: every two months during the first year, every three months during the second year and every six months after that.

- It always comes back to communication: "If you can't communicate, you're in trouble. If you can logically communicate with each other, then you're already ahead of the game."


- Reconnect with your feminine side: Take a bubble bath, drink a glass of wine, do your nails – just do something feminine.


He said: Holly was a good support system for Mike believe it or not. He got sympathy points from everyone because of her. I think he played as good or the best of anyone there.



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Edward Bass on the Importance of Relationships – In the Movies and In Real Life

The mind of a serial killer is something that is both intriguing, and at the same time, disturbing. With motives that are primarily based on psychological gratification, these types of killers usually have a method to their madness, one that drives their actions and limits their inhibitions. Belle Gunness, America's most prolific female serial killer, is no exception.

Director, writer, producer, and Golden Globe nominee, Edward Bass, is producing a film that captures Belle's story in the most deep, dark, and irresistible way. His past films have all been accepted into major film festivals and have included talents such as Sir Anthony Hopkins, Ashley Judd and Kevin Spacey. His extraordinary yet challenging life contributes to every project that he tackles, adding a complex and unique angle. His directional debut of *Belle* is sure to reflect his personal history, sharing the story of Belle Gunness and portraying the practice of serial killing more intimately than ever before.

The story came to life for Bass when his friend, actor, and directing coach, Bjorn Johnson, introduced him to novelist Eva Mayer, whose family bought the Gunness estate. "Eva had all this information about the family. She had been working on the story for twenty years. In fact, her great-great uncle was probably one of Belle's victims," he says. Bass spent three years speaking with both serial killers and forensic experts in an effort to try and understand the emotional profile of this character.

The captivating story of Belle examines the life of a woman who kills over 100 men, and eventually falls in love with one of her victims. Bass explains, "All the reasons for a deep, true love are there for her: she likes him because he's goodlooking, not very powerful, and younger than her. She can dominate him." Belle's love interest soon realizes that she is a serial killer and obviously wants to leave and call the police. Instead, Belle locks him in her basement and continues to kill older, greedy men. "But, she can't kill him," Bass explains.

It is for this reason that Bass believes *Belle* is a relationship film. "It's a classic theme about a woman looking for love and never quite finding it," he says. "And when she finally does find love, it eludes her. As they say, you can't live with him, and you can't live without him," Bass jokes, referencing a famous saying. Bass is still in the casting stage of production but hopes to begin shooting the film in early 2012. He has yet to determine who will play Belle, but he has a very clear idea of what type of actress it should be. "It needs to be a strong woman, a woman who can kill men," he explains.

Of course, one cannot help but wonder: Why did Belle do it? And Bass is quick to answer. "She was a nasty pig. She was greedy and killed for money. She got away with it. Maybe she enjoyed it, but it doesn't matter," he explains. "You can have all sorts of urges, but you have to control them."

Belle is a challenging character. She's a woman who kills men, women, and even her own children. Bass describes her as a one-woman crime wave, and the most prolific serial killer in American history. What makes Belle even more interesting is the fact that's she's virtually unknown. Despite her character flaws, he says the audience will feel empathy for her because of the multiple dimensions in which the story is told. As Bass says, "You won't really love her, but you will find her fascinating and hate yourself for it."

When asked if his past influences what he chooses to write and produce, Bass again focuses on the importance of relationships. "I have interesting relationships with people, and I bring them to each film," he says. "I think the most important thing in a relationship – which is the easiest thing to do – is honesty. Most men aren't honest, but you have so much power if you are."


Addressing his rumored dalliances with actresses in past films, he says in jest, "That's not true. Only Anthony Hopkins and I dated, and we were drunk." A little laughter and sarcasm are probably necessary given the darkness of the film. However, to defend the question on a more serious note, he adds, "It's not that I look to date actresses – I really don't. It's just that you spend every day on set, and you become attached to the people that you work with. I think it is proximity and opportunity."

When asked if he learned anything about women through Belle's story, he ironically says, "Women are so much brighter than men in every way. There would be no war if women were in charge."





In light of these upcoming Hollywood nuptials - a wedding

that's expected to be as grand as the royal wedding — this celebrity hair colorist offers a bit of advice to future brides. "Unless it's in your personality to make bold decisions with your look, I wouldn't recommend a shocking change before your big day," she says. "You want to look at your pictures and feel timeless. I think most brides want to look like the most polished version of themselves."

Of course, other factors, like season and location, impact a bride's choice of hair color, as well. According to Friedman, "If you're getting married in the summer time, or on the beach, beautiful, hand-painted highlights on slightly deconstructed waves seems fitting. On the other hand, for a winter wedding in the city, you may want to opt for a deeper, richer shade styled into a more-textured low bun."

While a bride-to-be should stick with what she knows, single girls have the flexibility to be a bit more playful. "You are single and want to look your best — you never know who you will run into! Lightening up your color, or using multiple tones to add sparkle and dimension, is sure to make you feel flirty," she says.

But remember: you should never change your hair color for a man. Friedman regards this reasoning as a big no-no and says, "The attraction should be there regardless of your hair color."

A broken-hearted girl, however, should be a bit more cautious. "Wait until you're less emotional or start slowly by adding a few face framing highlights or a gloss," recommends Friedman. "You can always go more drastic later."

After all, "in the throes of a heart ache, what seems like a good idea, sometimes is not — like eating a whole container of ice cream!" Friedman cautions.

At the end of the day, whether you're a bride-to-be, a single girl ready to jump back into the dating world, or a girl with

a broken heart, there is a "golden rule" when it comes to changing your hair color: "Honor your personal style."

Before making a color change, Friedman advises all girls to do their homework. "Find a very capable hair professional to [make the color change] for you. Be realistic about how achievable the target color is for your complexion and your hair," she says.

Since the right hair color is different for every girl, Friedman believes that you should "play up what you have," offering this advice to girls of every shade: "If you're a redhead, add a fiery, copper gloss. Blondes can try paintedon, surfer-girl highlights with a few random low-lights. As for brunettes, they can stay multi-tonal by adding some sparkly toffee and toasted-walnut strands around their hairline and tips."

According to Friedman, regardless of your base color, there are six important questions to ask your stylist before making a major color change:

1. What is a realistic level of lightness for me to achieve given my current hair color?

2. Will previous chemical treatments on my hair affect how light I can go?

3. What tones will best suit my complexion?

4. Will the texture of my hair change after I lighten it?

5. How often will I have to come in for touch-ups?

6. Do styling products for color-treated hair really work?



Well, I probably would put George Clooney in boot camp with Tiger Woods, Jesse James, and Arnold Schwarzenegger. Although, I think George is a serial monogamous. He dates someone for two years, and then gives his woman a parting gift. He is like Simon Cowell — you get cash and a car. He is not as bad as Tiger, Jesse, and Arnold though. 


How do you keep yourself from giving into temptation?

Jersey Shore Creator SallyAnn Salsano Dishes about Love in Italy and Her New Weight Loss Show, "Love Handles"

When it comes to the topic of love, ABC's *The Bachelor*, MTV's *Disaster Date*, and *Shot of Love with Tila Tequila* certainly have that in common. But, finding your amore isn't the only thing that bonds these shows together. They've also had the fortune of being produced by SallyAnn Salsano, a 37-year-old, fist-pumping dynamo, who is best known for creating the pop culture phenomenon, *Jersey Shore*.

SallyAnn's newest reality television endeavor, Love Handles airs on Lifetime Television this weekend. The show is an hour-long docu-series featuring a dual transformation of overweight couples as they attempt to save their lives and relationships by confronting what lies at the core of the emotional, dietary and physical issues deeply affecting their well-being. Think *Biggest Loser* meets *Dr. Phil*. Whether it's a couple who gained weight together and are trying to get the spice back in their love life, or the woman who feels overly self-conscious because her man is thinner than her.

We had the chance to catch up with SallyAnn and she gave us the scoop on what we can expect to see this season:

What can you tell us about *Love Handles*? What makes the show different from other shows of its type?

It's about couples who feel like they're stuck, and we show their transformation. I mean, you have to go to work, raise your kids, go to the gym, cook for yourself, and deal with your life. That's the situation most people are in when they have to lose weight. Some people are granted the opportunity to shut down their life and dedicate themselves to losing weight, but in *Love Handles* people have to fend for themselves and just do it.

The other thing about *Love Handles* is that it's not just about losing the weight. It's a show about therapy, and what's really going on inside. It gives you a rare look at couples that are in complete, raw therapy sessions. For most of these people, they have never been to individual therapy, so forget about couple's therapy. For the first time, they talk about what's bothering them, not only about themselves, but about the person they love the most. So sometimes they're just like, "Well, I don't know if I love this guy. I don't know if I could see myself with him." You should see their partner's reactions; it looks like their eyeballs pop right out of their heads because it's the first time they've ever heard that.

What are the relationships like on the show? Is everyone married?

They're all in different stages. Some of them are in a relationship, but will not get married until they lose weight. Others won't get married to their partner because they don't want a fat bride or groom. Some of the contestants are engaged, but can't buy the wedding dress because they're overweight. There are also newlyweds who are in the first year of marriage and gained 80 pounds. Some couples have been married for ten years and gained hundreds of pounds along the way and lost the intimacy they once had with each other. Every couple has their own unique story. Or, it could be that he's skinny and she's fat -it's all stuff everyone deals with and it's not only women who are self-conscious about their weight, it is men too. So you put that together – two people

who are not feeling good about themselves — and the word toxic doesn't even do it justice. They're in a position where they don't even love themselves. They need to figure out what's going on inside before they can figure out if they want to be with this other person.

How does Love Handles parallel your own life?

Well, I'm 37, in a relationship, and I'm really happy. But, I was in a previous relationship for seven years. We had a great time, a great house, and all the bullshit. He loved me, I loved him. But, I just wasn't happy. I was so overweight, and I think that I blamed my unhappiness on anything but that. It wasn't until I got my stuff together and lost the weight that I realized I had to move on. I threw out everything I owned and gutted my house. I did a drastic, crazy person clean out, and started over. I've never been happier. I won't say that the relationship was bad, because it wasn't bad at all. It was really me and that's kind of where *Love Handles* came from.

I think a lot of girls want to get married and have a family. And, they're looking for one guy who says yes. It doesn't even have to be the right person. For me, it's not the first person you find to say, "yes." It's the person you want to grow old with, rich or poor, the person you want next to you.

What is it about love that makes these shows so popular?

Well, I think everyone is on the endless search for love. I think even if you find someone, and you get married, you're always wondering if this is the greatest love of your life. Is this what love is supposed to feel like? I think it's all anyone ever wants. Everyone equates love with happiness. Every girl, every guy, every adult, even if you're married or single, it doesn't matter. You watch these shows, and you fantasize right along with them. Everyone wants a fairy tale.

Before we go, we need to ask some Jersey Shore "LOVE" questions! First, will we see a good love story in Italy? Well, there are people falling in and out of love in Italy. I would say that it's hot and cold in that house. I love this season. Every season I do the same thing. I come back, and I'm like, "What if nothing happens? What if nothing goes on?" Let me tell you something. I got all the way to Italy, and I was like, "Are you guys kidding me?" I was sitting there and would not leave the control room for 20 hours a day. That's when you know it's good. This particular season is interesting, because they were away. They didn't have all the comforts of home, and all the interactions with their friends and family that they usually do, so there was a bit more conflict than you've seen before.

What's the status of Sammi and Ronnie this season? Can you give us a little hint?

Well, the status depends on what episode (chuckle)! You're going to see a little bit of the Sammi and Ron you knew before, and then the Sammi and Ron who takes a turn. It's really interesting. I think they finally come into their own. Sometimes, I think you grow up when you're apart.



Love is going to be the key factor. When the crap hits the fans, in the end, all you will have is love!



A do-it-yourself (DIY) date night is the perfect solution.

Monica Pedersen, lifestyle expert and television co-host of *HGTV Dream Home Giveaway 2011*, recently dished with us about her own relationship with husband, Erik and five ways to plan a romantic evening that won't break the bank.

"Everything I do is under budget, real do-it-yourself,"

explained Pedersen, who taped *Bang for Your Buck* this summer, a show where she works with a realtor to evaluate newlyrenovated houses and help people figure out how to redecorate their home on a smart budget.

This fashion-model-turned-design-student always had an interest in interior decorating, perhaps because of her parents: her father was a handyman, and her mother enjoyed to sew. But what caught HGTV's eye in hiring Pedersen was her ability to put together a room that would sell, without spending a fortune.

It's no surprise, then, that this TV personality enjoys the simpler pleasures in life when it comes to creating intimacy with her husband. "We've always had a chalkboard in our kitchen, and my husband writes me love notes on it, says Pedersen. It can be anything like, 'Welcome home,' or 'Good luck on your shoot." She even takes pictures so she can cherish the sweetest messages forever. "It's silly, but it's a romantic little thing that means a lot."

Writing a message to your partner doesn't cost a thing, and it can really increase the intimacy in a relationship. If you're tight on money, start thinking outside the box for ways to spice things up!

Here are five tips from Pedersen to make your very own at-home date night feel like a special occasion:

1. Light the scene: Create a romantic atmosphere with candles. If large pillars or candelabras are out of your budget, purchase some inexpensive tea light candles and place them in small glass votives on a table, around a room, or by the bathtub! In the world of design, nothing sets the tone faster than lighting.

2. Make it a tradition: Uncork a great bottle of wine and toast your partner. Pedersen is a fan of Rutherford Hill Merlot from Napa Valley, CA, which was served at her wedding.

She advises writing your toast ahead of time so you can read it to your date. It shows that you put thought into the evening. To start a new tradition, date the cork from that night and tuck it away. Pedersen has a collection of corks marking special date nights in a glass box on her coffee table.

3. Create the perfect pair: If dinner is part of your date night, make a dish that you know your partner will love, bring out the fancy table settings (using the "good stuff" is a great way to turn a typical evening into a special occasion) and turn on some "mood" music.

4. Add a thoughtful touch: Save money and time with inexpensive take-out and a mixed bouquet of fresh flowers. These two items can make a simple date at home feel unique. Bouquets usually cost under \$10 at most grocery stores; if you're near a Costco, pick up a bouquet of their fresh-cut roses for a bargain price. Remember, it's making the effort that counts.

5. Invite the crew: If getting a babysitter is a problem, include the kids in your plans. For instance, let them each create a list of all the reasons why Mom loves Dad and Dad loves Mom. Or have them choose a romantic comedy DVD that you can all watch together.

"Never apologize for having a small budget," Pedersen emphasizes. "It pushes your creativity!"

Pedersen adds that her father gave her the most important piece of relationship advice. "He said, 'You know kid, you need to find a hobby, something that you guys can do together.'" So what do the Pedersen's do during their time off? Golf!


"When we got married, I said, 'I want you to teach me to play golf.' Now, it's something we do together; we've traveled all over the world to different courses," said Pedersen. The couple plays every Saturday afternoon and then enjoys takeout for dinner at the same place each week. "His friends always say, 'You want to play golf with your wife?' But it's our thing that we do together – cell phones off, no Blackberries – it's just him and I, spending time together in nature."

Pedersen recommends that all couples pick something that they can enjoy with their partner — whether it's fly-fishing, wine-tasting or simply grabbing take-out from your favorite restaurant — make a tradition out of it.

He reminds me of a few characters from past seasons who wanted to be the next *Bachelor* so bad – Jake Pavelka, Ed S. and Reid R. from season 5 and Jeremy A. from season 4.

What do you think about Ben's admission that he was

"unavailable" at the beginning of the journey? Is this type of admission a red flag to you?

I think J.P. and Ben's edits are so chopped up that we will never really know what is what. I think production was trying to even the playing field with this episode by editing, so both of the final two guys look like they are at the same point with Ashley.

These contestants are always taken to places where they jump off cliffs, swim with sharks, etc. What if a contestant is afraid of these feats or they simply don't know how to swim? How do they get around doing these activities?

Production has you fill out a 1200 question test before you go on the show. Therefore, the participants know all of this beforehand, and the producers plan which dates to give each person.





Cupid Exclusive: 'Divorce Court' Judge Lynn Toler Talks Divorce, Domestic Violence and Hollywood Couples

The celebrity lens can make relationships look frivolous. Two year courtships disintegrate as easily as a pair of worn-out running shoes, and headlines of "Betrayed," "Cheating," and the big "D" – Divorce – along with paparazzi shots of miserable stars fill the newsstands daily. Divorce is an issue Cupid's Pulse takes seriously, and who better to talk about it than Judge Lynn Toler from the popular TV series *Divorce Court*? As a celebrity divorce expert, she has more than enough experience to offer solid, real-world advice for our readers.

For the past five years, Judge Toler has been the host of television's longest running court program. A Harvard

graduate, she has written two books, including *My Mother's Rules* — which not only shares the wisdom of her mother, but takes an honest look at her childhood as the daughter of a man who struggled with both mental illness and alcoholism. She has seen divorce firsthand countless times and has been part of the messy situations that can arise when two people who took vows of love are now each other's worst enemies. We asked Judge Toler for her perspective on divorce, relationships and Hollywood couples. Take a look at what she had to say:

What's the number one reason people get divorced?

It's hard to say, but people who marry young have the most number of divorces. They don't know how to manage the marriage. You think if you get married the relationship will just handle itself. You need to decide how to argue, you need to make plans about the money, or that mother-in-law that you don't like. You need to manage your relationship, and I think most people don't end up doing that.

How can people who marry young sustain their relationship when divorce statistics are so high?

Marriage counseling before marriage. Don't wait until the boat is swamped. Get somebody who is older, who has been there and done that. You don't have to have any problems, but problems will arise. You have to be mature and in a position to respond appropriately. The first thing I would do is get marriage counseling.

Are there signs that suggest a relationship is heading for a breakup or divorce?

Yes, there are signs:

1. Withdrawal: When somebody is non-responsive, not engaging. When the fighting has stopped, and this person is like, "whatever." That's usually what they call one of The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse.

2. Globalizing: When "You don't take the garbage out," becomes, "You never do anything I want you to do." You're adding pieces to the "I'm getting ready to go" pie.

You can tell when people make that shift. It's either everything or nothing bothers them. Of course, infidelity is always a big one too.

Are there red flags that women should be aware of before heading into marriage with the wrong man?

Yes, I think this is important for women who are attracted to controlling men. I call this the "Widdled Away Women" and I see them on *Divorce Court* a lot. These are the folks who really want to get married and tend to overlook stuff. Some of the things you cannot overlook:

1. Needs you too much too soon: If he met you on Tuesday and can't live without you on Friday. That's a possessive personality; it's not romance.

2. Gets angry easily: If he gets mad easily with other people, or about other things, it's only a matter of time before he's comfortable enough to get angry with you.

3. Always check out the family: How do the women in the family get treated? What is the script that he is reading off of? Is his pops mean to his mom?

These are some of the signs that this guy may not be the guy that you want. When speaking in general when you are talking non-gender, always remember that this is as good as it gets. Don't get married and think that your problems will be over. If it's not good now, imagine it half as good — and can you live that way? Remember: In the beginning, everyone is looking good and compromising. So if it's not good now, don't even bother.

Who would you say had the messiest Hollywood divorce?

I think the LA Dodgers McCourt divorce in my opinion right now is the messiest. Others would include Alec Baldwin because of the children, and of course, Britney Spears and Kevin Federline.

Do you think that celebrity couples in some way contribute or play a factor in real-life relationships?

Yes, absolutely. The quintessential example of that is the royal wedding: "Some day your prince will come." It's the dream of all women to find their soul mate. Kate (Middleton) and Prince William are on every cover, and this news feeds the fairy tale that so many women want.

What are some lessons we can learn from reading about celebrity relationships?

Again, it's a fairy tale. Celebrities have a lot of problems with the fairy tale belief of love. They are used to getting what they need and want. They have the elaborate wedding, the vacation, and then they are off for six months making a movie and they don't see one another. Their partner is lonely and temptation sets in. Or, they wake up next to a spouse and the fantasy is over when they realize someone has to take out the garbage. They realize it's not the person they thought they married.

Which celebrity couple has surprised you most?

I would have to say Angelina Jolie and Brad Pitt really surprised me, even more so that they have stayed together. It was concerning when they started having all of these kids, but they are doing so well. Raising these kids is probably keeping them together.


