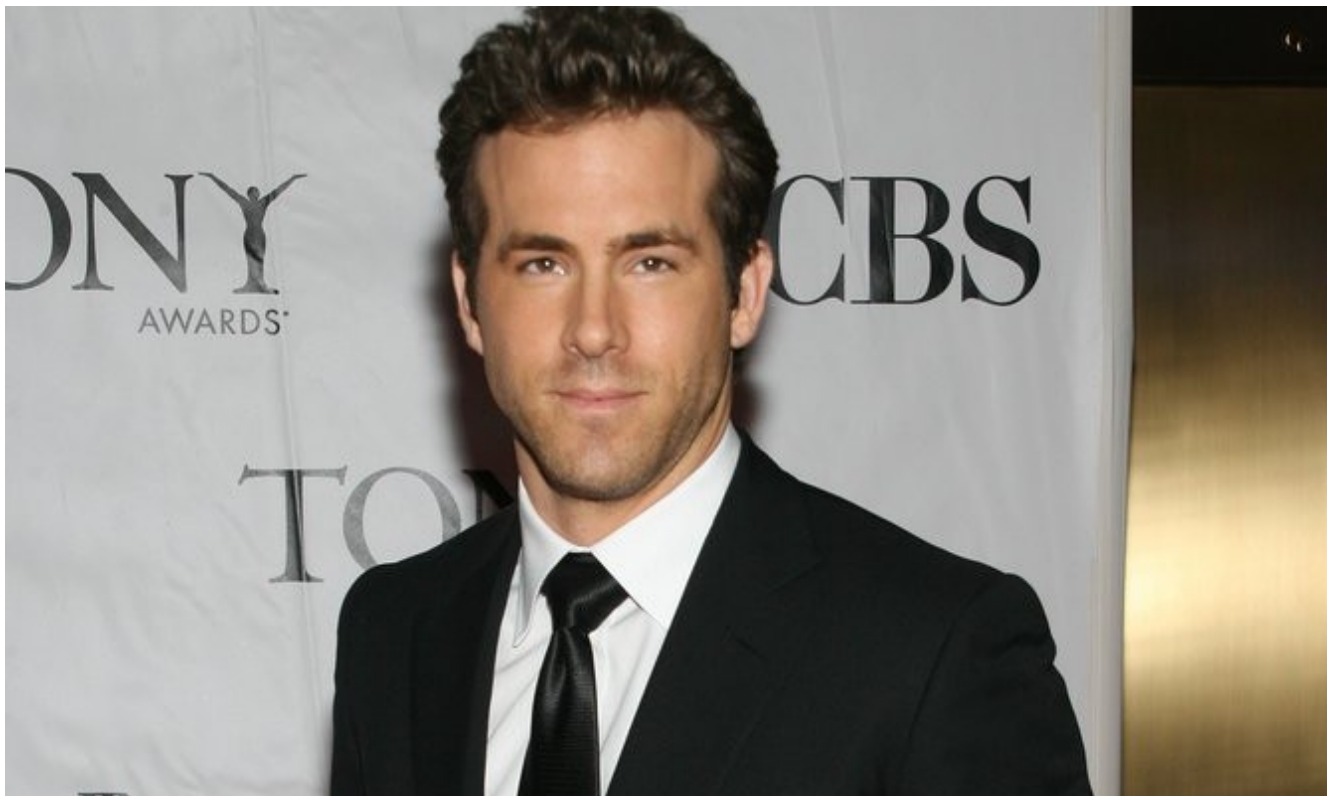
After marriage, how can you decide where to call home?
